<u>The course description of the Obstetrics and Gynaecology:</u>	
<p>The duration of the practice is at least 5 weeks and at least 180 hours. Goal of the practice:</p> <p>Establish a knowledge base in practical obstetrics and gynaecology. Acquire the skills and abilities needed to evaluate patients with obstetrical or gynaecological problems. Be able to distinguish normal and pathological conditions.</p> <p>The course takes 180 hours (usually 5 weeks) and covers the all practical aspects of obstetrics and gynaecology. Students should take part in the routine work of different wards:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none">1. Intensive care unit Preoperative management and medication of the patients. Pre- and postoperative laboratory examinations and their evaluation. Postoperative care. Removal of drains and sutures. Intramuscular, intravenous injections, infusions. Monitoring and management during early postoperative days.2. Gynaecological department Taking medical history and filling in case history charts. Bimanual gynaecological examination, use of the speculum, rectovaginal examination, examination of the breast. Observation of gynaecological surgeries and assistance in them.3. Labour ward, childbed, neonatology departments Observation of labour, examination of cervical dilatation during labour. Helping in the suturing of episiotomy. Methods of obstetrical analgesia and anaesthesia. Monitoring of foetal well-being during labour. Acute labour-ward care of the newborn. Apgar score. Observation of the	

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puerperal patient. Routine examinations of the newborn. Respirators, incubators, infusions in managing premature infants. Care of term and preterm neonates.

4. Pathological pregnancy unit

Bimanual examination of patients in early pregnancy. Examination of pregnant women in late pregnancy: Leopold manoeuvres. Evaluation of foetal well-being. Management of threatened preterm labour. Examinations and managements in different pregnancy complications (twin gestation, gestational hypertension, preeclampsia, placenta previa, (gestational) diabetes mellitus, cholestasis, etc.) Sonography in pregnancy.

5. Outpatient clinics and Oncological unit

Gynaecological examination, use of the speculum, taking vaginal smear. The use of colposcop. Work at the special consulting hours: family planning, infertility, endocrinology, paediatric gynaecology, climacteric counselling, andrology, gynecological oncology.

Special gynaecological-oncological examinations. Indication of operative procedures. Use of cytostatic agents.
